

Certificate IV in Aged Care

CHC40108



Certificate IV in Aged Care is designed to equip workers to provide physical and social support to elderly individuals and people with a psychological disability in hostels, group homes and community settings. With a strong practical focus, you will be taught the basic skills required in such a career, including:

- Carry out activities related to maintaining an individual's wellbeing through personal care and/or other activities of living
- May provide services to individuals with complex needs, and/or work with groups of older people, work may include training and support to promote independence and community participation, which may be provided as part of activities and programs in a variety of settings including residential and centre-based programs
- Report to service managers and liaise with professionals and other service providers
- May be required to supervise and/or coordinate a limited number of other workers

Occupational titles may include:

- < Personal care worker
- < Day activity worker
- < Hostel supervisor
- < Assistant hostel supervisor
- < Care supervisor
- < Residential care worker
- < Care team leader
- < Accommodation support worker
- < Program Co-ordinator – Social programs
- < Support worker

COURSE REQUIREMENTS:

DOMESTIC STUDENTS

Training and assessments are conducted in English. Applicants must possess sound written and oral English skills. You will be required to complete a Pre-training and Language Literacy and Numeracy Assessment.

INTERNATIONAL:

Must have an IELTS score of 5.5 or equivalent

Must be 18 years or older

Completed year 12

TRAINING DELIVERY:

DOMESTIC:

Students have two options.

They can choose from either a classroom based delivery or blended learning.

Classroom delivery: Face to face training and practical placement.

Blended learning and practical placement:

Blended learning is a mixed learning experience with some of the delivery in the classroom with a facilitator, some as self-paced learning and some during the practical placement.
